Q: Is a tub-to-shower conversion a good idea for resale?

A: Yes, but with a caveat. Most real estate experts recommend keeping at least one bathtub in the house for families with small children. However, converting the master bath tub into a large, luxury walk-in shower is currently one of the highest ROI projects you can do, as modern buyers prefer accessibility and spa-like showers over soaking tubs.

Q: How long does a typical bathroom remodel take?

A: A standard "remove and replace" (keeping the same layout) typically takes 2–3 weeks. A complex custom remodel involving moving plumbing, installing a custom tile shower, and heated floors usually takes 4–5 weeks.
